Managed Deer Hunting Program Pre-Screening Information:

Thank you for your interest in the M-NCPPC; Montgomery Parks Managed Deer Hunting Program. The following is a description of the program and instructions for how you can become involved. Please read this information carefully and fill out the required forms completely. **PLEASE NOTE: Pre-Screening Application forms are accepted throughout the year with a deadline of the 3rd Friday in August for the upcoming season. Pre-Screening Applications received after the 3rd Friday in August will only be considered for the following season. Furthermore, participation of individuals under the age of 18 years is limited to Little Bennett Regional Park only. Participants under 18 must be accompanied by their parent or legal guardian.**

In an effort to relieve impacts resulting from deer in and around select parks, the Department of Parks conducts deer management programming to appropriately maintain deer densities. Our foremost goals are to maintain safety and to harvest an appropriate portion of the deer population annually, in order to achieve a stable or negative recruitment rate. However, we work hard to provide participants with a quality hunting experience and success. Currently, all managed hunts allow for shotgun hunting only and occur in four park locations during the fall and winter. Three parks only permit treestand hunting, while one permits hunting from the ground or from a treestand. Participants are required to pass a State Shooting Qualification test annually.

We seek participants who:

1. Understand and support the goals and objectives of the Deer Management Program.
2. Will prioritize safety and regulations above personal interests.
3. Are experienced, safe hunters capable and willing to harvest multiple antlerless deer.
4. Are consistent, reliable and willing to dedicate time and effort under a variety of conditions.

In order to be approved to apply to the Department's managed deer hunting lottery, applicants must first submit the attached waiver and questionnaire and demonstrate, by photocopy, having completed a State hunter education/safety course (photocopy of certificate and/or card required. Numbers by themselves will not be accepted). Staff will review the Pre-screening questionnaire for knowledge of safety practices, regulations and deer hunting experience. In addition, staff will conduct a background check to investigate prior infractions that might compromise the integrity of the managed deer-hunting program.

Following staff review, you will receive notification informing you of approval or denial to apply. Assuming that there is no reason for dismissal from the program, you only need to be approved once to apply to the hunt lottery annually. If approved, around Labor Day each year you will receive lottery application materials to participate. Detailed information regarding participation requirements and procedures will be included in these application materials prior to the lottery and/or in the selection materials issued following the lottery. If you are denied the opportunity to apply, you may continue to submit the pre-screening packet, to try to become approved. However, you may only submit one pre-screening application per season.

Statement of Hunter Ethics & Waiver of Liability

As an approved participant of Montgomery Parks Managed Deer Hunting, I hereby agree to adhere to the hunter ethics standards below at all times while hunting or scouting in the Montgomery Parks Managed Deer Hunting Program(s):

- I will obey all of the Maryland Department of Natural Resources (hereinafter referred to as the “DNR”) Hunting Regulations and follow all Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (“hereinafter referred to as the M-NCPPC”), Montgomery Parks Rules and Procedures.
- I will respect members of the public while participating in scouting and hunting activities.
- I will respect the rights of other participants at all times.
- I will use rifled slugs or sabot slugs of 20 gauge – 12 gauge, only.
- I will make every effort to avoid unnecessary wounding of wildlife and will shoot at stationary targets less than 80 yards only.
- I will take the utmost precaution to assure the safety of others and myself.
- I will honor the Department’s priority of program goals (Safety → Management Objectives → Hunter Satisfaction) and place them ahead of my personal, recreational goals.

Assumption of Risk and Indemnification

I _____ (name of participant), the undersigned, assume all risks and shall be responsible for all personal or bodily injury to myself and others and damage to my property and the property of others, arising from my activities as a participant in M-NCPPC Montgomery Parks Managed Deer Hunting.

Furthermore, I agree to indemnify and defend the M-NCPPC and hold it harmless from and against any and all claims, suits, damages, liabilities and expenses, including attorney’s fees and the county’s cost of defense, in connection with the loss of life, personal or bodily injury and/or damage to or loss of property that arises from my participation in the program. This indemnification is not to be deemed as a waiver of any immunity that may exist in any action against the M-NCPPC.
