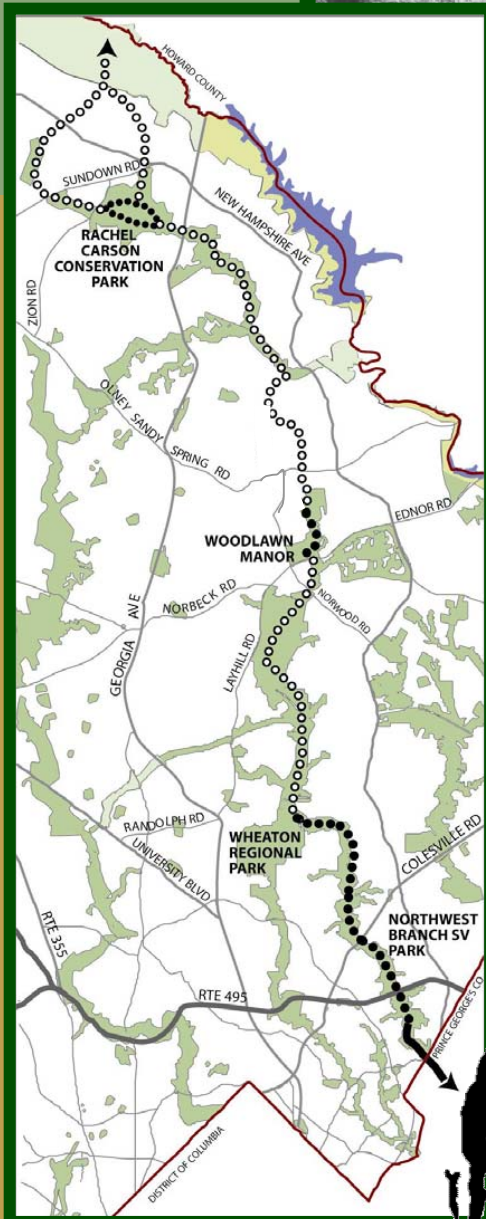


Rachel Carson Greenway Trail Corridor Plan
